The 14th Batch's graduation ceremony was held on May 22nd at the Mugda Training Center, where participants basked in the glory of receiving certificates of accomplishment. Complementing this milestone, ration packages including essential provisions – rice, pulses, potatoes, onions, oil, and other staple groceries graced their hands.

On May 2nd, a fresh group of eight trainees commenced their transformative journey as part of the 15th batch. Grounded in the principles of empowerment and self-determination, this initiative strives to arm these individuals with the essential skills and resources required to forge a path toward a sustainable future.

During the month of May, the training for the 15th batch was in progress, where eight women previously engaged in prostitution received comprehensive instruction from a skilled trainer. On May 25th, The trainees were profiled at the Mugdha Training Center.
